ADVOCATING FOR FARM TO SCHOOL: HOW TO HOST A SITE VISIT WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS

Are you planning a special farm to school event this fall? Showcasing your farm to school efforts is one of the most impactful ways to advocate for farm to school! Some officials may have never heard of farm to school before, and site visits are a great opportunity for them to learn more. Giving decision makers at any level or branch of government the opportunity to experience your farm to school program firsthand will not only make them familiar with farm to school, but also allow them to interact with those who benefit the most.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES



CLASSROOM GRANTS DEADLINE: SEPT. 15

CHS Foundation provides \$500 grants each year to pre-kindergarten-12th grade teachers who have classroom projects that use agricultural concepts to teach reading, writing, math, science, social studies and more. Eligible projects include classroom and schoolyard gardens, embryology projects (i.e. incubating chicken embryos inside fertilized egg until they hatch), aquaculture projects (farming of aquatic organisms, such as fish, shellfish, and plants in water environment for food, products, or conservation), and agricultural literacy reading programs to name a few. Teachers have until June 1 of the following year to complete the project and submit a final report. Only state-certified classroom teachers employed by a school district or private school teachers are eligible to apply.

In partnership with the Bee Cause Project, Whole Kids Foundation Bee Grants allow for schools and non-profit organizations to receive support for educational beehives and bee programming so students can observe bees up close and learn about the vital role these pollinators play in our food system.
